# A Running Report By Russell Frazier

There are certain times of the year that lend themselves to reflection. I find myself reflecting on Good Friday.

The last few months have been full of activities. I share these with you hoping that you will see some concerns and pray with me.

On Saturday, February 25, I left Nairobi for Nashville. I arrived the following day on Sunday evening. I spent the day with dad and Judy. I spent some time with my sister and her family in the evening. The next day, I drove to Indianapolis to hug some grandchildren. Then, I drove to Wilmore, Kentucky to attend the Wesleyan Theological Society meeting and presented a paper on Saturday, March 4. In the evening, I drove to the western part of Kentucky. On Sunday, I represented missions at the Mayfield and Paducah churches. It was a wonderful time to reconnect with the friends in those congregations!

On Tuesday, March 7, I arrived back in Kenya. Five days later, I was on a plane to Goma, Democratic Republic of Congo. (I don't think that Carla was too happy about it.) In Goma, I taught a course on biblical interpretation to pastors in the Nazarene Theological Institute. On Thursday and Friday, I participated in a graduation ceremony for NTI graduates and an ordination ceremony for pastors in Africa Central Field. On Sunday, I attended services at the Katindo church, and in the evening, I had some meetings about FATEN. I returned to Nairobi on Monday, March 20.

While in Goma, I received a message from Carla. Have you received a phone call that communicated a life-altering message? You can remember where you were and what you were doing. In June, Carla and I were in the States, I received such a phone call from my dad. We were traveling for deputation services from Florida to Louisiana. Dad announced to us that Judy, his wife of more than 27 years, had been diagnosed with Lou Gehrig's disease or ALS. The prognosis was not good. While in Goma, I received another such message. Judy passed away on 18 March. Carla contacted me from Nairobi. We weren't able to attend the celebration of life, but we celebrated her life. She was a wonderful Christian lady. She was a blessing to our family. Please pray especially for my dad.

Upon returning to Nairobi, I began working on the touches for *Transform: A Journal of Biblical, Theological, and Practical Studies in the Wesleyan Tradition*. I serve as the production editor for the online journal. The journal is a collaborative effort between numerous Wesleyan theological institutions in Africa. We felt that the Wesleyans in Africa needed to find a voice. Thankfully, we have a voice in Tranform.
