Sabbath Rest by Russell Frazier

April and May were very busy for me at Africa Nazarene University. I handed over the Deanship of the School of Religion and Christian Ministry to one of my colleagues just about a month before my departure. I was grateful to be relieved of some of the administrative responsibilities. The handover cleared my path for a sabbatical, which began in mid-May.

I left Kenya on May 21 and spent six weeks in the United Kingdom for research and writing. I conducted research principally at the John Rylands University Library, where I focused on the sermons of John William Fletcher (1729-1785). In addition, I travelled to Cliff College in Calver, England and Shropshire County Archives to do further research. I anticipate publishing some original sermons of John Fletcher's that have not yet been published.

Many of you may know that John William Fletcher was a seminal figure in early Methodism. Some of his sermons have been published, but many have not seen the light of day outside the archives. I transcribed (with assistance) the sermons and compared the transcriptions with the originals. I am really excited about this project! It was made possible through some relief from my everyday responsibilities.

Just before boarding the plane for the US in London, I took some time to visit some of the French Huguenot Chapels, where Fletcher preached after he was ordained in 1757 and before assuming the incumbency at Madeley in 1760. Wesley rented the buildings at the time. I enjoyed visiting the chapels and seeing the places where Fletcher actually preached.

I am very grateful to the Global Mission and Manchester Wesley Research Center. It was a tremendous time to be able to work on a project that I think will impact Christianity in general, but especially on the Wesleyan Holiness movement. Thank you for your support and your prayers. May God bless you richly!
